Subject of Review:	Understanding why poor diets and subsequent rising obesity rates among Americans has occurred concurrently with an increased awareness and publicity regarding the benefits of a healthy lifestyle provides an opportunity to incorporate elements of behavioral economics into consumer food choice analysis. This paper develops a consumer demand model to illustrate how both long-term health objectives and immediate visceral influences, long intervals between meals and eating away from home, can drive individuals' food choices. The model predicts that cognitive dietary information will be less influential on food choices in the face of visceral factors.
