Subject of Review: Biogas recovery systems that use methane from manure to generate electricity have not been widely adopted in U.S. mainly because the costs of these systems have exceeded the benefits they provide to operators. Proposed climate change legislation could create a carbon offset market allowing livestock producers to earn revenue from burning manure methane. However, there is likely to be wide variation in the scale, location and characteristics of operations that would benefit, which could have long-run structural implications for the livestock sector. In addition, the extent of participation in offset markets will help determine the supply and price of carbon offsets and hence the costs that "capped" industries face in meeting emissions targets. This study develops an economic model that illustrates how dairy and hog operation size, location and manure management methods and electricity and carbon offset prices influence methane digester profits.
