Subject of Review: Organic food products are highly differentiated, and thus are likely candidates for being produced and marketed via contract. This report provides insight into contracting in the organic sector, including who uses contracts, the extent of contracting, the rationale for using contracts, as well as discusses contract design for some specific commodities. The analysis relies on survey data collected from certified organic intermediaries in the United States on the marketing and procurement of organic products in 2004 and 2007. Contracting is widespread in the organic sector, and nearly all contracts required suppliers to provide evidence of organic certification.
